

Curriculum-Based Support Group (CBSG[®]) Program Facilitator Training

The CBSG[®] Program is designed to increase resilience in children and youth who experience adversity, trauma and toxic stress through the development of healthy social, emotional and coping skills in a caring support group setting.



CBSG Program Facilitator Training Includes

- Theoretical foundations of the CBSG Program
- Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and the impact of trauma & toxic stress
- Resiliency
- Risk and Protective Factor research
- Social Emotional Learning (SEL)
- Facilitator's role in implementing the CBSG Program
- Opportunities to practice facilitation skills
- Implementation strategies
- A copy of one Facilitator Manual adaptation of your choice (additional adaptations may be purchased for \$125 once trained)
- Each adaptation has a USB with all necessary program handouts (**English & Spanish**) and Quality Assurance materials with reproduction permission.
- Follow-up technical assistance regarding implementation, adaptations, notifications regarding program or manual updates/addendums

Training Settings & Costs

The Trans4m Center Hosted Trainings:

Fee: \$250 (Includes one Facilitator Manual adaptation)

Site-Based Contracted Training:

- CBSG Program Trans4m Center Trainer at your location on mutually agreed upon date and time
- Fee: \$3,500 (up to 15 participants receiving one Facilitator Manual adaptation per participant)
- Each additional participant over 15 - Fee: \$150
- Reimbursement for Travel - Market rates apply
